Tar Wars

The program is designed to teach fourth and fifth graders about the short term, image-based consequences of tobacco use, the cost associated with using tobacco products, and the advertising techniques used by the tobacco industry to market their products to youth.



Tobacco Aging Simulation

Designed for 7th – 12th graders, this simulation easily and dramatically shows the aging effects of chronic tobacco use on the face. Using a digital photograph, tools are used to apply the common characteristic of a "smoker's face" aging. "Before" and "After" photos are shown side-by-side.
